

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North Derbyshire Field Trip

18-20 September 2015


The field trip will visit key outcrops in the Greater Castleton area of North Derbyshire. The late Visean to Namurian succession of carbonate and clastics together with the regional setting offer an excellent opportunity to examine an exhumed hydrocarbon system analogous to the East Midlands hydrocarbon province further South in Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire. The excursion will provide an opportunity to examine all elements of the hydrocarbon system and to discuss hydrocarbon charge and trapping as well as related unconventional shale reservoir systems. The outcrops will be supplemented by subsurface data to demonstrate different elements of the petroleum geology. There will also be opportunities to examine recent structural deformation and discuss the insights they offer into understanding and visualising extensional and strike-slip tectonic regimes.

Purbeck Field Trip

Led by Matt Wakefield & Steve Etches

26-27 September 2015



The fossiliferous mudstones of Dorset's Jurassic Coast are world renowned and collectors flock to the Lower and Middle Jurassic successions. in the west of the county. Less well known is that the Upper Jurassic Kimmeridge Clay, one of the principal source rocks in the North Sea, also yields a beautifully preserved vertebrate and invertebrate fauna which provide a tantalising insight into the ecology of this mudstonedominated succession. Through decades of painstaking collection and curation, Steve Etches has amassed a fantastic fossil collection and the PESGB has been working with Steve to make his collection accessible to the public.
